Voting for the Advance Poll will take place on **Thursday, August 15, 2019** between the hours of 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. in the Stirling Room of the Community Services Building at 117 Allan Avenue.

Election Day

Voting on Election Day will take place on **Wednesday**, **August 28**, **2019** between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the Stirling Room of the Community Services Building at 117 Allan Avenue.

Who Can Vote?

Persons eligible for voting must:

- be at least 18 years old on Election Day;
 - be a Canadian citizen:
- -a resident of Saskatchewan for at least 6 (six) consecutive months immediately preceding election day;
- either: A) a resident of the municipality for at least 3 (three) consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election; or B) an owner of assessable land for at least 3 (three) consecutive months immediately preceding the day of election.
 - Identification with a civic address must be presented as proof of residency in the Town of Saltcoats.
