Thank you very much for letting me write a few things about our special town. A special thank you to Walter Farquharson. This December we will be married 60 years. Just a bit of news last year I found out I had a sister. We meet and it was love at first sight. She lives in Alberta and we just hit it off. It was wonderful.

In closing we want to thank Bob Hume. Jim is nearly blind and Bob takes Jim out for rides. We also want to thank all our neighbors everyone looks out for us and help us when they can.

Current Garbage and Recycling Service

- 1) Curbside pick up for HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE (Black roll out bin)
 - 2) Curbside pick up for RECYCLING (Blue roll out bin)
- 3) Dumpster #1 on High Street for OVERSIZED HOUSEHOLD WASTE
 - 4) Dumpster #2 on High Street for METAL ONLY
 - 5) Dumpster on Allan Avenue for COMMERICAL RECYLCING
- 6) Special requested Dumpster from OSS for construction/renovation projects
 - 7) Tree pile site, turn right off Crescent Lake Road, Grid 725

#1) Black Roll Out Bin for HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE

Bagged house hold garbage, grass clippings, leaves, paper towels, tissues, syrofoam, vacuum contents and bags, dryer sheets, foil bags, ined pet food bags, clothing/textiles of any type, diapers, baby wipes and sanitary products, tissues, and cigarettes.

#2) Blue Roll Out Bin for RECYCLING

Flattened clean cardboard boxes, office paper, newsprint, magazines, catalogues, phone books, paper bags, milk jugs, milk and creamer cartons, plastic beverage bottles, tissue roll cores, cereal boxes, paper gift wrap and packing paper, paper egg cartons, rinsed bleach containers, juice cans, and other non-glass beverage containers, yogurt and sour cream containers, plastic salad dressing bottles, plastic containers-ONLY numbered 1-7, tin and aluminum cans with or without labels. ALL FOOD CONTAINERS MUST BE CLEANED.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED IN THE BLUE ROLL OUT BIN (Even if there is a recycling emblem on them)

Styrofoam, even if it has recycling emblem or number on it, glass, toys, clothing/textiles of any type, plastic wraps, plastic bags, lightbulbs, ceramics, soiled cardboard, hazardous chemical containers, scrap metal, car parts, wood, household garbage, or clam shell style ie) fruit, produce, baking containers or restaurant take out containers.

#3 DUMPSTER #1 on High Street for Oversized Household Waste

Use for oversized household waste that will not fit or can not be reasonably broken down to fit into the curbside roll out bins. Examples are mattresses, furniture, bagged garden waste, grass clippings and leaves.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED IN DUMPSTER #1 ON HIGH STREET

Unacceptable items for dumpster #1 Bagged household garbage, appliances, batteries, oil, paint, propane tanks, tires, and recycling materials (cardboard and plastic containers).

NO CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS ALLOWED IN ANY BINS OR DUMPSTERS.

As per Bylaw #07-2010 of the Town of Saltcoats, no persons shall carry on any business within the town, unless and until he/she has procured a license to do so.

Fees for a 2021 Business License with the Town of Saltcoats -\$40.00

Business with the R.M. of Saltcoats-\$40.00

Any other business—\$60.00

Failure to comply shall constitute an offence under Bylaw #07-2010, with the first offence being a minimum \$50.00 or a maximum \$200.00 penalty.

Fire Permits

As per Bylaw 09-2018, "The Fire Pit Bylaw" the cost of the annual permit is \$20.00 per address. Permits are in effect from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

Pet Licenses for 2021

It is mandatory for any person residing within the town who keeps, possesses or harbors any dog and/or cat, to obtain a pet license. Pet License fees for 2021 are now due. For the safety of all persons and animals involved, please ensure your pet has been vaccinated for rabies within the last 2 years.

Dog & Cat Licensing Fees:

Males: \$25.00, Females: \$25.00, Spayed or Neutered pet: \$10.00

Required Information for a License:

Proof of vaccination for rabies within the last 2 years. Proof of spaying/neutering if applicable (if not already on file). Color photo of pet (if not already on file).
