SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING

Single-stream recycling is a system in which all recycle materials - fiber, plastics, tin and aluminum - are placed, unsorted, in the BLUE Recycle Cart or Container.



PAPER

- Cardboard
- Boxboard
- Office Paper
- Newsprint
- Junk Mail
- Magazines
- Catalogues



PLASTICS

- Plastic Containers
 - Milk Cartons
 - Plastic Milk Jugs
 - Plastics numbered 1-7
- (No Food Containers labelled #1)*
(No oil containers or chemical jugs, no plastic wrap or bags)



METALS

- Tin and Aluminum Cans
- (cans must be clean, with or without labels - no steel or auto parts)*

Bins on High Street

It is illegal to place garbage, metal, and etc. on the ground if the bins are full, this is known as illegal dumping and littering. Please take garbage and/or steel back to your property until the bin is empty.

Recycling and Garbage

Please be mindful that recycle materials are clean, washed out, and not contaminated with food or other items that are NOT RECYCABLE. The Town of Saltcoats was fined \$112.50 for contaminated recycle in March.

Important Notice

Construction is scheduled to start May 10, 2021 around the existing Water Plant (401 Gibson) and the existing Lift Station (South end of Allan Ave).

To accommodate equipment and work being done the east end of Tupper (Town Shop Alley to Gibson) and the South end of Allan Ave (Intersection of Crescent Lake Road and Allan Ave) will be closed to Public Traffic.

Closure may not happen immediately but once initiated may last for most of the Summer.

The Town asks residents to be prepared to plan alternate routes in response to the closures.
