Message from the Mayor

As most of you probably already know, I have been acclimated as the new Mayor of Saltcoats. I would like to thank Gordon Barnhart for his services over the past two years while serving as mayor and wish him the best in his move to Alberta. I would also like to thank everyone that has reached out with words of support and encouragement.

As Mayor, my main goal is to help council keep the towns current course. I believe we are all doing our best to achieve the goals we had set when we were first elected for our positions. We have been able to maintain our budget with minimal tax increases, even with the federal inflation rate around 8%, and we plan to carry out the street paving program as previously planned. Each year council will review the streets and affecting factors and determine the best course of action. There are always projects that come to the table, but none as big as the paving plan and water treatment plant.

The water plant is getting close to completion and will be tagged as "substantially complete" any day now. This means the plant is 100% operable and just has a few small items to finish up that do not affect the operation of the plant.

Our current council now has one vacancy, this will create the need for a by-election, this will be held on November 23rd with Nomination papers to be handed in by October 19th. More information can be found at the Town Office. If you are considering running for council but have questions, I encourage you to reach out to a current councillor or myself to get a better understanding of the position.
